Roofing Company Truck Stolen

Sometime over the weekend and before 9am Sunday morning 01/08/12, unknown person(s) burglarized the J.P. Patti Roofing Company garage and removed miscellaneous items including tools, then drove off with a company truck, a red 1987 GMC open rack truck with NJ license plates AC350D. When an employee was at the garage on Sunday morning to retrieve an item, it was noticed that a window on the garage door had been broken and the door's mechanism was damaged. The employee decided to wait and check with other employees on Monday morning to see if they had any knowledge of the damage. Upon return on Monday 01/09/12, police were called and it has been determined that a forcible entry of the garage was made and the suspect(s) drove off in the truck after dismantling the locked chain link fence bordering Route 46 eastbound side. The truck, valued at approximately \$5,000 was entered stolen into NCIC database. Saddle Brook Police Detective/Sergeant John Zotollo has been assigned the investigation.

Juveniles Arrested for Underage Possession of Alcohol

Saddle Brook youths were charged with being in possession of alcohol after being unruly and verbally abusive on church grounds on Sunday evening, January 8, 2012. While attempting to disperse four youths congregating and causing a disturbance on the Korean Martyr Catholic Church property on Saddle River Road and Bell Avenue, a priest encountered at least one of the youths yelling obscenities of which the priest wouldn't repeat to investigating officers because of the extreme vulgar nature of them. When officers were dispatched to investigate, the youths were later found off the property and in possession of a Gatorade bottle containing alcohol. It was determined that two of the youths had been consuming the alcohol and were the ones on the church property, one urinating in the church's parking area. Two of the youths, 16 year old males, were charged with underage possession/consumption of alcohol and all four youths, including two females one 14 year old and one 15 year old, were charged with being out in public after 10PM in violation of the Township's curfew local ordinance. The charges will be forwarded to Bergen County Juvenile Court for processing.
